Pete initially studied biology and graduated from Imperial College London in 2002 before going on to study medicine at the University of Warwick, from which he graduated in 2006. After undertaking his first two years of junior doctor training in Coventry and Warwickshire, he commenced GP training in the West Midlands Deanery.
